
Thanks to Pam Cornell and Willowside Ranch for hosting this event. It is a beautiful facility and I particularly enjoyed having to wear a jacket in July!

Here are some notes about

the trial designs held on two separate and different fields.

Open field:

- ◆ 120 acres with lots of different terrain
- set out pens in every corner of the field
- a different course each day
- outruns from 650 to 750 yards
- day 4: double lift, turn past the post, international shed and pen for all handlers

Second Field: Open Ranch [Pro Novice], Ranch, Novice classes

- ♦ 40 acre flat field
- Open Ranch class: 250-300 yard outrun, full drive, pen for
- Ranch: shortened outrun and drive to prepare handlers for Open Ranch class Note: for this class, an open handler may take in a young dog if it has not competed in another class before

And amenities for trial participants:

- ♦ 3 cooked means offered daily with a free handlers dinner Friday night
- ◆ Adequate shade, Porta-Potties, dunk tanks, garbage containers on each field

- Water for stock, dogs and trailers is filtered
- Gifts for each handler
- Early arrivers can rent sheep to practice with dogs
- Trial manager promptly returns query calls
- Award checks given each evening
- Crews of friends, students, members of the Herding Club contribute to the success of the trial
- Lots of paddocks and fenced areas to air groups of dogs
- ◆ The town of Mountainair is 3 to 4 miles away
- ◆ Turner Inn and RV Park has all necessary amenities including friendly managers, showers, septic off-load privileges, laundry room and more...

The Future Plans for Free to Be Ranch...

- Purchase 20 more contiguous acres to extend the venue on the open field side
- Increase electrical and water outlets for RVs
- Septic facility near gate for off loading
- Bid for the 2010 Nationals.

Recipe for Puppy Chow Pie

Ingredients:


- 1 baked pie shell or graham cracker crust
- 1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 3 tbs. peanut butter
- 2 tbs. margarine
- 5 cups vanilla ice-cream

Mix and stir chips, peanut butter and margarine in small



pan over low heat until melted. Stir constantly. Set this mixture aside to cool to room temperature. Set about 5 cups vanilla ice cream out of freezer until you can stir it with spoon and mix in the chocolate mixture. It will not fully mix in, it sort of marbles.

Spoon into pie shell and freeze for 2 hours. When ready to serve, take out of freezer 5 minutes before serving.




